A Personal Note

The end of October (hailing the beginning of November) is noted for a couple of things. Of course, our secular world focuses our attention in many ways on the observance of Halloween. Popularity of Halloween decorations has exploded in recent years, and Americans are expected to spend some \$10-12 billion on Halloween this year.

For Christians, another observance (occurring on the same day) has greater theological significance. That is naturally Reformation Day. On October 31, 1517 (All Hallows Eve, the day before the observance of All Saints Day), Martin Luther posted his 95 Theses on the door of the Castle Church in Wittenberg, Germany. This action is traditionally seen as the beginning of the Reformation, a huge turning point in Western Christianity.

One source says, "Martin Luther claimed that what distinguished him from previous reformers was that while they attacked corruption in the life of the church, he went to the theological root of the problem—the perversion of the church's doctrine of redemption and grace. Luther, a pastor and professor at the University of Wittenberg, deplored the entanglement of God's free gift of grace in a complex system of indulgences and good works." Thus Reformation arose from a theological understanding trying to address misunderstanding in the teaching and doctrine of grace and salvation in the Medieval Church.

Luther's teaching (and ours today) emphasizes that Holy Scripture is the sole source of teaching and practice for God's people and that from that source we learn that justification (or salvation) comes solely by God's grace at work in Jesus' life, death, and resurrection (and NOT from any human works of any kind). Faith in that gracious offer of salvation performs renewal in our lives, enabling us to live God-pleasing and neighbor-serving lives in this world. May our hearts thrill to celebrate that blessed Gospel message each day!



A THANKSGIVING HYMN THAT SEES GOD'S HAND EVERYWHERE

For a hymn that captures the beauty and gratitude of Thanksgiving, All Things "Bright and Beautiful" is a perfect choice Its lyrics paint vivid pictures — flowers opening in the morning sun, birds singing, golden sunsets, purple-topped mountains and rivers rushing by. It all leads to this joyful reminder: "He gave us eyes to see them, and lips that we might tell: How great is God Almighty, who has made all things well."

The hymn was written by Cecil Frances Alexander (1818–1895), an Irishwoman with a passion for teaching children about God. She wrote many hymns for her Sunday school class, later collected in *Verses for Holy Seasons*.

But her ministry went beyond music — she spent her life serving the poor, comforting the sick, and caring for the grieving. When she passed away, "a great throng" gathered to remember her, honoring both her faith and the beauty she shared with the world.

CURRENT, FUTURE, AND PROPOSED PROJECTS

- Both preschool building air conditioners have had repeated service calls due to cooling issues.
 Evaporator coils in both units have multiple pin hole leaks. Due to age and the phasing out of R-410A refrigerant to the newer 454B, recommendation is to replace the evaporator and exterior condenser units. Waiting for the quote from Bowling Green Refrigeration.
- Both sets of interior double doors leading into the gym do not work correctly due to faulty hardware issues. Received and approved quote from Bluegrass Commercial Door and working on scheduling.
- The double doors leading out from the gym into the front grassy area are being propped open by facility
 users. Looking at economical options to keep doors closed but allow users to go outside and inside
 without propping the doors. Considering an electric door push bar that can be controlled with an
 exterior keypad. Received quote, will discuss at next Board meeting.
- Pye Barker completed annual sprinkler inspection. Working with Pye Barker to schedule backflow test and sprinkler head sample testing.
- Sunday School room is being prepped for a fresh coat of paint.
- Pye Barker tested the fire alarm system and found two issues: Horn in EO building stairwell not working and the double doors leading into the EO building were slow to close. Working on scheduling repairs.
- Cleaning and sealing of gym floors scheduled for Christmas Break.
- Preschool classroom (across from the school office) was written up by the health inspector for peeling paint. Plan is to paint the room during Christmas Break, if ok with the health inspector. If not, will need to plan to paint earlier.
- Insulation that covers the large exterior ducts leading into and out of the air handler on the roof which services the EO building has multiple large holes and deterioration. The insulation needs replacing and we are searching for companies that do this type of work for quotes.
- Sanctuary and Narthex Remodeling. Project moved to summer 2026. Need five-six volunteers to form a
 design committee to select two to three paint colors and flooring options for the congregation to
 consider.

PROPERTY MINISTRY TEAM

COMPLETED DURING OCTOBER

- Water leaks in the gym: Stewart Richey repaired the leaks. Monitoring to make sure there are no further leaks and if none, they will come back and install the insulation that covers the pipe.
- Installed an additional card access at the Church office entrance. Users with cards can now enter the
 church office lobby area. Users that we granted a temporary exterior key will be contacted to return the
 key to the church office since they will now have access with the card.
- Water heater that services the gym bathrooms and two sinks in the kitchen was repaired due to faulty controller.
- Intermittent power issues in the facility; BGMU replaced a faulty transformer.
- Trane completed quarterly preventive maintenance for the HVAC system that services the EO building.
- Installed solar lighting inside the property shed.



VETERAN'S DAY Tuesday, November 11

A DAY TO HONOR OUR VETERANS

On November 11, 1918, the Germans and the Allied Nations, which included the United States, signed a document to initiate an armistice (cessation of hostilities), thus ending World War I. A year later, President Woodrow Wilson issued a proclamation designating November 11 as Armistice Day. It was to be a day of reflection — a day to remember those who died in the country's service and to offer Americans the opportunity "to show sympathy with peace and justice in the councils of the nation."

Wanting to recognize more specifically America's veterans, Congress passed a bill changing the name of the day from Armistice Day to Veterans Day. The change was made in May 1954.

On this national holiday, churches around the nation hold services of prayers and praise. Followers of the Prince of Peace pray for peace among the nations of Earth and for the day when "they shall beat their swords into plowshares, and their spears into pruning hooks; nation shall not lift up sword against nation, neither shall they learn war any more" (Isaiah 2:4, NRSV).






