A Personal Note

Reflecting on recent events surrounding the murder of Charlie Kirk, I have come across several items that I believe are worth our consideration. Pardon me if I share some lengthier quotes. One is a comment about the importance of prayer, shared with me by one of our members.

“Prayer is action. It’s effort. It takes time. Christians believe God is an actual participant in history. He’s here, every day, in the trenches. He didn’t create the universe and disappear into the mists; his creation is an ongoing event, he is here in the world with you. When something terrible happens and you talk to him—that’s what prayer is, talking to him, communicating with concentration—you are actively asking for help, for intercession. . . It’s active, not passive. It isn’t a way of dodging responsibility, it is (if you are really doing it and not just publicly posing) a way of taking it.”

We desperately need prayer, ongoing, sincere, intentional, continual prayer, asking our Lord to guide our deliberations, our conversations, our actions. We want to live as those who announce and embody the new kingdom of peace and grace that Jesus came to establish. Another post that I saw on Facebook by a pastor friend uses Luther’s *simul justus et peccator* picture to speak of recent events.

“Many see Charlie Kirk as a ‘saint’ who stood up for Jesus Christ, the sanctity of life, freedom of speech, immigration law enforcement, and more. Others see him as a ‘sinner’ who made statements that smacked of racism, misogyny, white supremacy, Christian nationalism, and worse. Luther’s teaching that a Christian is simultaneously saint and sinner is one of the central tenets of Lutheran theology. The Latin expression *simul justus et peccator* identifies a paradox regarding the nature of the believer’s existence after justification by faith. It is not a 50/50 division, but a complete reality in two different contexts.

“A faithful application of God’s Law will tell us again and again that we are poor and miserable sinners who fall way short of God’s glory on a daily basis. A faithful application of the Gospel will comfort us again and again with the beautiful truth that in God’s eyes, believers are forgiven saints because of Jesus Christ. Will the death of Charlie Kirk divide us further or bring an increased unity? Perhaps both can be true at the same time. I don’t know. What we do know is that there is a unity to be found in Christ, in His sanctuary, in His Word, and at His Table. We do know that as often as we confess our own failures and flaws to our God, that often His grace sweeps over our souls, our marriages, our families, our circles of friends, our communities, and yes - our nation.”

We dare not idolize our human heroes, nor dare we scorn and denigrate those with whom we disagree. Like my pastor friend just quoted, I don’t know which direction events will move in our land as we have experienced another horrible tragedy, death imposed on an important leader. But my ongoing prayer is that we will continue to confess to our Lord the ways that our actions and words have contributed to disunity and discord – and that we will receive from His hands the forgiveness which will empower us to live new and redeemed lives to Jesus’ honor and praise! Onward and upward, dear friends in Christ!

LEA is a national professional organization that provides resources and hosts conferences on education related topics. Several of the staff volunteer to attend the convocation and then share what they learn with the rest of the staff.

Our first quarter comes to an end on October 3rd. We take a break for a week and then come back to a very busy schedule. Our Fall Festival will be held on October 17 at the Hot Rods stadium again this year. We are blessed to have this organization partner with us in allowing us to use their venue for this event. There will be auction items, food, games for the kids, a cake walk, bounce houses, and an opportunity for fun and fellowship. This is one of our bigger fundraisers that helps our PTO provide \$15,000 in scholarship assistance to students in need.

CURRENT, FUTURE, AND PROPOSED PROJECTS

- Both preschool building air conditioners have had repeated service calls due to cooling issues. Evaporator coils in both units have multiple pin hole leaks. Due to age and the phasing out of R-410A refrigerant to the newer 454B, recommendation is to replace the evaporator and exterior condenser units. Waiting for the quote from Bowling Green Refrigeration.
- Both sets of interior double doors leading into the gym do not work correctly due to faulty hardware issues. Received quote from Bluegrass Commercial Door and working on scheduling.
- Water leaks in the gym. Stewart Richey inspected the roof drainpipe that runs through the interior of the gym. The pipe needs leveling, joints inspected/repaired, and another support added for additional strength. Schedule for October 6-7 (Fall Break).
- Key project. We have received several signed forms, but will need to begin contacting individuals that records indicate have a key/card, but have not submitted a form.
- The double doors leading out from the gym into the front grassy area are being propped open by facility users. Looking at economical options to keep doors closed but allow users to go outside and inside without propping the doors. Considering an electric door push bar that can be controlled with an exterior keypad.
- Pye Barker completed annual sprinkler inspection. Working with Pye Barker to schedule backflow test and sprinkler head sample testing.
- Sanctuary and Narthex Remodeling. Project moved to summer 2026. Need five-six volunteers to form a design committee to select two to three paint colors and flooring options for the congregation to consider.

COMPLETED DURING SEPTEMBER

- The large Reznor makeup air unit which sits on the gym roof and supplies fresh air and pressurizes the EO building is now operating correctly. Lyons Mechanical installed and modified a new controller to work in the unit. Unit is at the end of its life and planning and setting aside funds for replacement should be considered.
- Sink holes in the large grassy area near the road have been repaired.

Latin for "The Word of the Lord Endures Forever," this motto of the Lutheran branch of the Protestant Reformation comes from 1 Peter 1:25. Frederick the Wise, ruler of Saxony and one of Martin Luther's earliest and most influential supporters, had the VDMA symbol sewn into the right sleeve of the official garments worn at his court. The symbol also appeared on banners, flags, swords, and uniforms, representing the unity of the Lutheran laity in standing firm in their faith.
