School is out for Summer!

On June 2 our Summer Care program will begin and enrollment is full. Many of our area summer programs have closed for one reason or another making our program one of the few that continues to serve our community. When other Christian schools or community programs fail to offer programs for families, Holy Trinity becomes the consistency that provides summer programming that our area families need and desire. Our summer program helps to pay for the stripping and waxing of our floors and the cleaning of our carpets each year which can cost around \$6,000. It also provides jobs for childcare workers and added income to our janitorial service. It will run for 8 weeks taking a week off at the beginning and end of summer.

We are working on filling open positions for the 2025-2026 academic year. We are in need of preschool aides, an elementary teacher, a cook, an art teacher, a computer teacher, and a foreign language teacher. God always provides when we have need and we trust in Him to continue to bless HTLS with servant leaders who value teaching children while integrating faith.

God has continued to bless our preschool and elementary school with families that value Christian education. We are also blessed to have a congregation who supports a Lutheran school. Any church that runs a school ministry will deal with challenges that can become divisive, especially as the school ministry grows and expands to using more of the facility. Holy Trinity Lutheran Church supports the school ministry in so many ways, which is vital to its health and future growth. May God continue to bless Holy Trinity Lutheran Church and School for the sake of the Gospel.
