



A Personal Note



As we continue down the path of calling a senior pastor for Holy Trinity, I thought it might be time again to review a few realities of the call process within our church body. The Lutheran Church—Missouri Synod is made up of about 6000 congregations, served by about 5500 clergy. To become a member congregation, each church pledges to call as pastors only those men who are listed on our clergy roster. Each district president is responsible to provide a list of qualified men to a congregation seeking a pastor. Individual members are also able to recommend the names of men they believe would be suited to serve.

The call is not considered a “hiring” process, but one which we trust is guided by the Holy Spirit. A church (as a body, not just a group within the congregation, in our case the General Assembly) votes to extend a divine call to a pastor. This is usually done after concerted work by a call committee and earnest prayer by the whole church. At that point, the ball is in the pastor’s court. He gives careful and prayerful consideration to the call and determines whether he believes the Lord is directing him to accept or decline that call.

Many factors come into play as a pastor considers a call: the needs of both congregations (the one he is serving as well as the calling church); his own evaluation of his strengths and weaknesses in ministry; counsel from circuit visitors, district presidents, and other trusted colleagues; opportunities for service and ministry in both places; the physical realities of moving (which often these days include selling and purchasing a home); family needs and circumstances; and many other things (as I know from personal experience).

We have just heard that Pastor Schian has decided prayerfully to return our call. I know it has been a long road for us in the call process, but I am still convinced that the Lord will provide a senior pastor for us who will be best suited to assist us in moving forward in ministry and mission in this place. In the aftermath of our Pentecost celebration, keep leaning on God’s promise of His Spirit to empower His people for service in Jesus’ name!

Smiths Grove Site Outreach

Ideally, worship services take place each week at the Smiths Grove site (First Christian Church, 427 College Street). They occur each Saturday at 5 PM. Prior to worship, Bible study is held at 4 PM. Unfortunately, during the past month we have had to cancel those services three times due to an infestation of fleas at First Christian's facility. We trust that hindrance is behind us.

Please continue your prayers that this outreach would provide more open doors for the Gospel and that the Spirit will lead many to worship the risen Savior. With the opening of Buc-ee's at Smiths Grove recently, there will be more people transitioning to this community. If you are living (or know someone who is living) in or around Smiths Grove, let us know so that we can contact them. Here is a church home where people get to know one another and grow in service to the Lord Jesus!

Call Update

Last month our congregation extended a call to Rev. Aaron Schian, currently serving Grace Lutheran Church in Auburn, MI, to serve Holy Trinity as senior pastor.

Sadly, Pastor Schian has determined that the Holy Spirit has directed him to remain at Grace for the time being. Thus, we give thanks for his careful consideration of our needs and the needs of Grace congregation and for the Spirit's guidance, even though the outcome is not what we had hoped for. Now we return to another edition of the call procedures. Please continue your earnest prayers for guidance to that man God wants to serve as senior pastor in Bowling Green! And if you know of pastors who would be well suited to Holy Trinity's mission, pass on those names to the call committee.

A WORD FROM THE DIRECTOR OF SCHOOL MINISTRY

Navigating Challenges

All Lutheran schools must navigate challenges, sometimes on a moment-by-moment basis, and Holy Trinity Lutheran School is no different. Here are some of the challenges that we are currently facing:

Staffing

Prior to Covid, it was becoming increasingly difficult to find quality preschool teachers. Since Covid, that trend has moved into the elementary teacher area as well. The public schools are also dealing with this trend and have had to make decisions as drastic as emergency certifying teacher candidates whose education is simply a high school diploma. The trickle-down effect of these

decisions is obvious.

Finding workers to cover extended care (before and after school hours) has been increasingly difficult as well. If enough workers cannot be hired to cover the demand, then parents have to either find other alternatives for childcare or they end up needing to pull students out of the school.

Parent support

One of the factors leading many of our teachers to retire or change vocations is the lack of parental support. In many cases, when situations present themselves the teachers find that the parents become accusatory and extremely protective of their children before they have heard both sides of the story. The challenges can be related to a wide variety of issues. On one extreme it may be dealing with students who are fighting, and on the other hand it can be dealing with things like not allowing a student to wear a smartwatch or bring juice in a water bottle.

Safety

The largest growing educational system is currently homeschooling. Parents feel as though schools are no longer safe places to send their children. Parochial schools have seen growth partially due to this factor. One of the first things parents ask about when touring our school is what we have in place to keep students safe.

Enduring

Our theme for the year reminds us that our walk as Christians is sometimes a struggle, sometimes painful, sometimes not very glamorous, and sometimes downright painful. This is a critical lesson for us to teach our children. If not, we create victims. Jesus did not create victims. He created a world with humans as his pinnacle of pride, and when things went bad he inserted himself into this world to save us from destruction. We are blessed to center on this truth as we deal with the daily challenges of serving as a Lutheran school in this community.

PERSPECTIVES ON PATRIOTISM

While pondering differences between patriotism and nationalism, Ryan Hamm looks to Jesus' example in Luke 19:41-44. "Jesus, it seems, loved his people, his city, his nation — so much so that he cried over it," he writes in Christianity Today. "He didn't despise his country or wish ill upon it — instead, he wanted nothing but the best for it, and it grieved him to see how his people had rejected his teachings."

This example of "patriotism perfected" can serve as a guide for modern-day Christians, according to Hamm. "It's an example that's both pragmatic and romantic, shot through with justice, truth and love. It's not a nationalistic patriotism — it's a love for nation that doesn't pit it against other nations. Instead, it's a recognition of love followed by a mournful recognition of shortcomings."

Put another way, God doesn't love America more than any other nation. And he doesn't want us to worship our nation alongside him, because that is idolatry. Instead, we are to love and proclaim God above any earthly realm.

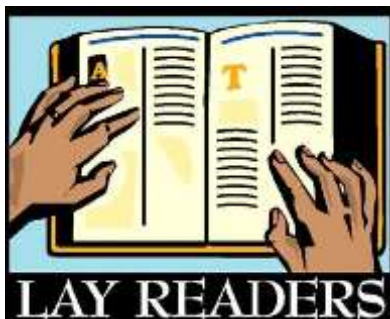

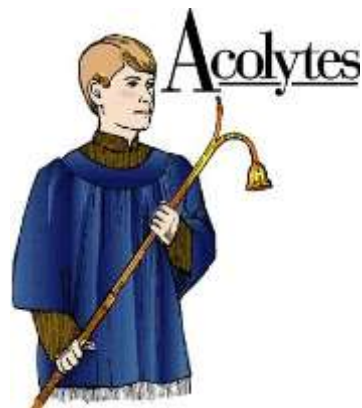
